Please answer the following questions about different educational scenarios honestly, to the best of your ability. Remember: there are no wrong answers.

1. Hardboot the Minotaur is a student with severe Conduct Disorder. After passing out an exam paper to the class, you find that Hardboot is adamant in his refusal to take the test. He impales the test paper on one of his horns and becomes verbally abusive. What do you do?

- A. Tell him that he will be given fresh meat if he completes the exam.
- B. Offer to help him by reading the exam questions out loud.
- C. Administer a swift kick to his groin and verbally threaten him.
- D. Allow him to stew for a while, then calmly ask if he wants to repeat the exam.

2. Gronket is a house troll who comes from a hostile home environment. During the day, she becomes increasingly agitated and refuses to participate in class. What do you do?
